TSA and Security Checkpoints

The Transportation Safety Administration (TSA) has specially designed lanes at security checkpoints for persons with disabilities. Wheelchair

Request wheelchair assistance on your airline's website or booking engine when you book your flight. This is the best way to ensure assistance is available in a timely manner. You may also request a wheelchair at your airline's ticket counter or from gate agents.

Airlines provide free wheelchair services for their passengers. Please contact your airline in advance to request this service. Once reserved, park and advise wheelchair dispatch of your location using the following number: 503-460-4300.

Elevators

PDX offers elevators connecting to baggage claim and parking garages. Elevators with Braille signage, raised numbers, and audible information are on each floor and parking garages.

Single-use restrooms are located throughout concourses C, B, D, and E. Consult a directory or information booth for the nearest location.

Service Animal Relief Areas (SARA)

PDX Locations for Service Animals and Pet Relief Areas:

- Pre-Security Checkpoint:
 - Outside baggage claim at the south end of the terminal (lower level)
- Post-Security Checkpoint:
 - Passed security for B and C concourses near Stumptown Coffee
 - Concourse C adjacent to the Alaska Lounge
 - Concourse D across from gate D5.

Ground Transportation at PDX

The airport's central location offers easy access to the public bus, shuttles, and light rail service, and both convenient and affordable ground transportation options are available for passengers. Please do not accept solicitations to assist with transportation or baggage from anyone who is not properly badged. Always seek assistance from airport employees with PDX ID badges.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Public Bus Service

Over 84 bus lines that crisscross over the Portland area. Visit trimet.org for more information regarding bus lines and light rail lines.

- Buses #1, #12, and #19 stop at SW 6th and Taylor
- Buses #4, #35, #40, #44, and #54 stop at SW 6th and Salmon

TriMet Bus System is accessible per Americans with Disabilities Act requirements. For city-wide route information and schedules, call (503) 238-7433 or https://trimet.org/home/.

Downtown Portland Street Cars

The streetcar operates from 5:30 a.m.-11:30 p.m. Monday-Friday, 7:30 a.m.-11:30 p.m. Saturday, and 7:30 a.m.-10:30 p.m. Sunday. The streetcar runs approximately every 15 minutes on weekdays and Saturdays, and every 20 minutes on Sunday. Arrival times are posted on real-time electronic signs at most streetcar stops.

- An adult streetcar-only ticket costs \$2 for 2.5 hours or \$5 for all-day. They can be purchased onboard any streetcar or ticketing kiosk at a station. Youth and senior 2.5-hour tickets cost \$1.25, and \$2.50 for an all-day pass.
- Riders can use the <u>Hop Fastpass App</u>.

Light Rail Service

The MAX Light Rail Red Line is the easiest way to travel to and from the airport as it is located near the Rental Car Center outside Baggage Claim (MAP).

- The trip between Portland International Airport and downtown takes about 45 minutes.
- As of 2024, an adult ticket costs \$2.50.
- The first train of the day arrives at PDX at 4:50 a.m. The last train departs PDX at 12:30 a.m.
- The MAX station and ticket machines are located on the lower level, next to the south baggage claim area (turn right at the base of the escalator). View the airport's map for more detail.
 - Receive a digital card prior to arriving for the light rail, download the Hop app on IOS or Android.

Fares

Tickets are sold at ticket machines at the rail stations or with a Hop App.

- Hop ticket machines at MAX and WES stations.
- You can buy 2½-Hour and 1-day paper Hop tickets from MAX and WES stations for Adults, Honored Citizens, and Youth riders from the Hop ticket machines.
- Reduced fares are available for seniors, youth, people with disabilities, people who qualify based on income, veterans, and active-duty military.

Taxi

Taxi and other transportation network companies ("TNC") such as Uber and Lyft can take you to and from the airport using wheelchair-accessible vehicles.

To request a wheelchair taxi, please contact PDX WAV at 503-865-4WAV (503-865-4928) 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, or by using your TNC app on your wireless device.

- PDX to Downtown Portland is approximately 23 min (11.1) mile via I-84 W.
- The average fare before gratuity is \$50.00.

Taxis depart from the Baggage Claim (lower) level outer roadway, which is wheelchair-accessible. Passengers in a wheelchair or with limited mobility may also request drop-off on the upper level (Departures/Ticketing) inner roadway. Please state clearly to your ground transportation service provider that you require mobility assistance to ensure they meet or deliver you to one of these locations.

*Rides to all other locations will be priced by metered fare per ordinance.

The Duniway

All of the featured sessions, exhibit hall, conference office, and most of the breakout sessions will be located at the Hilton Downtown Portland, while some breakout sessions will be located in Duniway. The properties are located across the street, less than a block apart.

Parking

Hilton Downtown Portland

The hotel entrance off SW 6th Street offers a pull-through driveway. There will be room to load and unload passengers/luggage on the right side. Valet parking is available with in/out privileges for \$55 per night. See the Valet Stand at the entrance for more information.

The Duniway

The hotel entrance, located off of Taylor Street, offers a pull-through driveway. There will be room to load and unload passengers/luggage on the right side. Valet parking is available with in/out privileges for \$55 per night. See the Valet Stand at the entrance for more information.

Self-parking is available off Taylor Street, next to the Duniway Hotel, Located at 525 SW Taylor St, Portland, OR. The garage charges a maximum of \$33.00 per day. Handicap parking spaces are available for vehicles with a state-approved placard. Elevator access is available with stops on the first and second floors of the hotel.

Height Restriction: 8'2"

TRIPS & EXCURSIONS

Registration for Side Trips & Excursions is part of your NODAC Registration and can be included as part of your initial registration or added later. During checkout, registrants have the option to split payment methods if necessary. Space is limited and is on a first-come, first-served basis.

Portland Spirit is wheelchair accessible on the Willamette Deck (1st level) with certain restrictions, and all have wheelchair-accessible heads (restrooms) on board. We can accommodate standard-sized manual wheelchairs and power chairs up to 32 inches wide. The ramp has a weight limit of 250 pounds (combined weight of chair and passenger). If you or your guest uses a power wheelchair, you may request a location on the vessel near a power outlet to charge your chair.

The bow and observation deck on the Portland Spirit are only accessible via stairs; the Willamette Deck (lower level) is accessible via ramp but is fully enclosed. We

have a wheelchair caddy to assist passengers using a wheelchair up/down the boarding ramp.
